initiative to create a game that it led the audience to play.


The photographs speak for themselves; of an afternoon filled with both laughter and gratitude.

become a mainstay event in the school, drawing MGS girls past and present (as well as some
of their male counterparts) to come and worship
the Lord together.

Last year, God brought a team of old girls from the Class of 2011 together to pray and plan for this event and discern what God would have to say to all who would gather at LOVEMGS. They settled on the theme "Christ is Enough," hoping to remind MGS girls that whether we have much or very little, whether our successes and achievements are numerous or few, God alone is sufficient for us.

Pastor Martin Tang (formerly of Changi Christian Fellowship) delivered God's Word at the event, sharing testimonies from his life that echoed the apostle Paul's discovery that "everything else is worthless when compared with the infinite value of knowing Christ Jesus my Lord." (Philippians 3:8, NLT). His life testifies to the truth that our greatest prize pales in comparison to all that Christ offers us, and our deepest hurts and problems cannot keep us from Him either. In fact, He often uses the painful and difficult situations in our lives to help us see that He is able to fully satisfy us and cause us to delight in Him.


### Souvenirs & Memorabilia
